Shelby County Reads - Season 7

Shelby County Reads was established to encourage literacy and to celebrate community. Now celebrating its seventh season, they invite you to join in related events scheduled throughout the month of February.

The book chosen this year is *Follow the River* by James Alexander Thom. It tells the story of Mary Ingles, a pioneer woman who risked her life and walked one thousand miles through untamed wilderness to return to her own people after being kidnapped by the Shawnee Indians in 1755. February will offer a series of events that focus on Native American history and culture.

An Open House to kick off the celebration will be held on Saturday, January 23 from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. at the Grover Museum, 52 West Broadway Street. At 2:00 p.m. there will be a presentation of "The Legend of the Linden Tree" also at the museum. The Open House also includes a Shelby County Indian artifacts display, Native American food tasting, a craft station, an exhibit of animals native to the region, and a Jan Winn Jenkins solo art exhibit. Copies of the SCR books will also be available for purchase. The Open House is open to the public, free of charge, and no reservations are required.
